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- → RPE and RPO are functions, not necessarily two different persons
- The role of the RPE and RPO in hospitals with respect to the MPE
- Input on QA matters from ENETRAP II

Core competences of the RPE



Agreement with draft proposals, but with:

- Ability to carry out and verify radiation measurements
- Ability to draw up Radiation Protection Programme
- Ability to provide QA/QC advice
- Understand the working procedures/equipment/etc within a specific practice (suitability)
- Ability to asses and resolve emergency situations
- Understanding of security requirements
- Ability to carry out dose reconstruction

Mutual recognition



- Comparison of national RPE qualification systems needed.
- Need to be aware that there are two subjects:
 - Mutual recognition of qualification
 - Mutual recognition of training scheme
 - Focus should be on mutual recognition of training schemes
- Steps for mutual recognition:
 - Proof that qualification has been awarded by correct body
 - Demand knowledge of relevant national regulations
 - Knowledge of language dependant on role carried out
- As agreed at previous workshop, recognition may be on a case-by-case basis


